Lunches and Snacks

- Daily snacks will be provided for your camper
- Lunch from home bring in lunch box
- Campers are not allowed to leave the building for lunch
- Lunches cannot be ordered and delivered to camp as this interferes with camp operations
- No nuts allowed to be brought to camp
- Forgotten lunches: We will contact parents so they can make arrangements with admin office that day
- Food (i.e. breakfast) other than lunch, snack or birthday celebrations will not be allowed during camp



Birthday Celebrations!

- Parents can arrange with camp staff during snack time
- Parents may attend the celebration
- Plates, napkins, utensils, etc.



Camp Attire - Normal Days

- Acceptable Camp Attire:
 - Mini Canes Recreational Sports Camp T-Shirt
 - Comfortable athletic shorts
 - Socks & non-marking sole tennis shoes
 - Bring: swimsuit and towel
- Unacceptable:
 - Flip flops, open toed shoe, crocs, heely's, non athletic shoes
 - o Denim
 - Short shorts
 - Campers wearing inappropriate clothing will be sent to the administrative office so they can call home and have a parent bring appropriate clothing
- What Not to Bring:
 - Blankets, stuffed animals, pokemon/baseball cards

Behavior Issues

Minor Incidents

- Profane and inappropriate language
- Not following directions
- Talking back to counselor
- Disrespect
- Pushing/shoving as a result of poor sportsmanship

Major Incidents

- Endangering self or others
- Unnecessary roughness
- Intentional infliction of pain
- Continuous minor incidents

First Offense

 Counselor will have a talk with camper and remind them of the rules. May notify parents at the end of the day.

Second Offense

Camper will take camper aside and talk to them.
Parent will be notified by phone or at the end of camp

Persistent Misbehavior

 Camper will be brought to camp office. If the decision is to remove the camper from Mini Canes, camp admin will write a discipline notice that will be sent home. Removal may be temporary or permanent, depending on severity. All cases are handled on an individual basis. No refund will be issued.

Drop-off and Pick-up

Morning Drop-off: 8:45 am - 9:05 am

- Designated Drop-off 8:45-9:05am
- First Day of the Session: Entering Centre Court, campers will be escorted by staff to their designated camper group location. Parents are not allowed to enter Centre Court (past the gates).
- All Other Camp Days: Campers will enter Centre Court and go directly to their camper group where they should check in with their counselors and leave their lunch box and book bag in the designated storage bins.
- If it rains or lightning is in the area parents must come in and drop their camper off.



Drop-off and Pick-up


Afternoon Pick-up: 4:00 pm - 4:15 pm each afternoon

Early Pickup

- Requests for early pickup must be made prior to noon
- Early pickup notices can be made at drop off or before 12pm.
- Email can also be sent to minicanescamp@miami.edu
- Pick-ups between 3 4pm are not allowed.
- Parents may designate other approved adults to pick up their camper by completing the Authorized Pick Up Form.
- Individuals will be required to show a government issued ID.

Before and After Care

Before Care: 8:00 am - 9:05 am

- Parents will drop off their camper in centre court where staff will check them in.
- No drop off service available at bridge at this time in morning.

Aftercare: 4:00 pm - 6:00 pm

- Parents will pick up their camper in centre court where staff will check them out.
- Snack will be provided.



Before and After Care (cont.)

- Extended care is available for an additional fee.
- Campers can be enrolled through the online wellness portal prior to the start of session.
- If campers <u>not</u> in before care and arrives before 8:45 a.m. they will be charged \$10 for every 15 minutes.
- Parents will be charged \$10 for every 15 minutes late. Time after 6:00 p.m. are billable minutes.
